Its owner, Sue Lim, shared in our adventures on our trip to Timbuktu in February. We journeyed there via Djenne, where she bought some bogolan blankets. We were eternally grateful for the quality of the blankets not long after she bought them, when we stayed overnight in a Tuareg village, south of the Niger river, and used them to keep us cosy beneath the starry desert skies...
